

Medical help in Darfur

AN AID worker is heading abroad to help provide medical care for people in Africa.

Peter Camp, 47, from Burgess Hill, is leaving later this month to work on a nine-month project in Darfur.

He will join a team of volunteers from the charity Medecins du Monde UK.

Mr Camp has been to Africa four times before but this is his first time in Darfur.

He said: "I have worked on projects abroad where you see seriously ill children.

"Often they are suffering from illnesses that can easily be remedied with medicines.

"To see a child make a recovery makes the whole job worthwhile.

"I know what a difference can be made and that is what appeals to me about working on this mission."
