

Outreach Volunteers (Non-medical)

The responsibilities of outreach volunteers include:

- Give talks and presentations to community groups and NGOs to ensure awareness of the services Project:London provides
- Conduct community-based outreach, including leafleting and postering, to engage with potential P:L service users and raise awareness about the clinic
- Identify key community groups and NGOs and contribute ideas for future outreach activities

Qualities for volunteering as an outreach volunteer include:

- Good social and communication skills
- Non-judgmental attitude and behaviour, and confidence in working with service users from diverse backgrounds
- Commitment to alleviating social exclusion by providing medical assistance to vulnerable people including the homeless, sex workers and migrants
- Fluency in English
- Previous experience in working with vulnerable people such as migrants or the homeless is an asset
- Fluency in languages other than English is an asset

Location

- Areas throughout London

Time required for the role

- Flexible depending on availability
- Minimum of one Outreach activity per month
- Can take place during the day or during evenings and weekends

Full training will be provided, and volunteers can also benefit from further workshops and seminars organised by Medecins du Monde UK throughout the year. Individuals from BME and refugee backgrounds are particularly encouraged to apply.
