Role Title: Volunteer GP

Reporting to: Services Team Supervisors

Where will you be based: Clinicians can choose between offering remote consultations (from home) or coming in person to our Stratford, East London Clinic.

Commitment requirements: one shift per month for six months.

Why you?

If you are a fully qualified GP, if you are friendly, empathetic, a good listener and passionate about upholding the human right to healthcare, this role could be a great fit for you!

Clinicians are an integral part of our services. They provide first line medical care for our service users both over the phone and in the clinic setting. GPs also act as advocates and liaise with NHS service providers to link the service users to the care they need.

What you will be doing

- Providing first line medical care to patients in our CQC registered clinic.
- Providing diagnosis and treatment as appropriate, including prescribing as required.
- Summarising consultation notes into letters for patients and NHS professionals.
- Advocating on behalf of patients to fellow medical professionals in the NHS.
- Providing information on other appropriate services.
- Promoting healthy living

Skills and requirements

- Fully qualified GP with full GMC registration and license to practice.
- Current or recent clinical experience.
- GPs need Medical Indemnity Insurance which covers working in the Doctors of the World clinic.
- The desire to help people excluded from healthcare.
- Non-judgmental attitude towards patients from diverse backgrounds.
- Commitment to work in accordance with the principles and values of the Médecins du Monde network.
- Fluency in English.
- Good social and communication skills.
- Ability to demonstrate current BLS; Adult Safeguarding Level 3; Children and Young People Safeguarding Level 3; up to date mandatory vaccinations in line with the Green Book.
- Fluency in other languages and confidence working with interpreting services is desirable but not essential.

* As per national guidelines, everyone who has direct contact with people in healthcare settings should be up-to-date with routine immunisations. If you are unsure of your vaccination status or have not been fully vaccinated, then you can speak to your GP. Vaccination against measles, mumps and rubella are part of the routine childhood immunisation schedule. You can receive them for free from your NHS GP surgery.

'You will be able to volunteer one month after completing the vaccination course.
