Role Title: Volunteer Nurse

Reporting to: Services Team Supervisors

Where will you be based: Nurses can choose between offering remote consultations (from home) or coming in person to our Stratford, East London Clinic.

Commitment requirements: one shift per month for six months.

Why you?

If you are a registered Nurse, if you are friendly, empathetic, a good listener and passionate about upholding the human right to healthcare, this role could be a great fit for you!

Clinicians are an integral part of our services. They provide first line medical care for our patients both over the phone and in our clinic setting. Nurses also act as advocates and liaise with NHS service providers to link patients to the care they need.

What you will be doing

- Providing first line medical care for patients in our CQC registered clinic, assessing individuals' health conditions and needs within the limits of their professional competencies.
- Advocating on behalf of patients to fellow medical professionals in the NHS.
- Providing information on other appropriate services.
- Promoting healthy living.

Skills and requirements

- Nurse with at least two years post qualification experience in the NHS.
- Full registration to practice in the UK – NMC.
- Medical Indemnity Insurance which covers working in the Doctors of the World Clinic.
- Current or recent clinical experience.
- Available to do at least one shift a month for six months.
- Ability to demonstrate current BLS; Adult Safeguarding Level 3; Children and Young People Safeguarding Level 3; up to date mandatory vaccinations in line with the Green Book.
- Commitment to work in accordance with the principles and values of the Médecins du Monde network.
- Fluency in English.
- Clear communication skills.
- The desire to help people excluded from healthcare.
- Non-judgmental attitude towards patients from diverse backgrounds.
- Good social and communication skills.
- Fluency in other languages/confidence working with interpreting services desirable but not essential

* As per national guidelines, everyone who has direct contact with people in healthcare settings should be up-to-date with routine immunisations. If you are unsure of your vaccination status or have not been fully

vaccinated, then you can speak to your GP. Vaccination against measles, mumps and rubella are part of the routine childhood immunisation schedule. You can receive them for free from your NHS GP surgery. You will be able to volunteer one month after completing the vaccination course.

The HR onboarding and induction process may take several weeks. Please take this into account when applying, to make sure that our minimum commitment request matches your availability.
